Cafe on the Hill



A Coleshill couple have been serving up meals and treats to the local community over the past 18 months – after being served up support with their online presence.

Tina and Dale Glastonbury run the Café on the Hill in the town after starting the business at the beginning of 2019.

Just a year after launching, Covid hit and, for a fortnight and like many other businesses across the region, they went into a state of shock. But once they started to come to terms with the crisis, they started to look at opportunities to keep the café serving customers during lockdown and for any support available.

They'd already built up an online following on social media and, through that, started delivering to customers in the town including everything from Sunday lunches through to afternoon teas for special occasions.

Tina also found about digital support available and that was a key breakthrough in helping Café on the Hill reach more people.

The workshops were delivered by Coventry and Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce and Stories Marketing, on behalf of Warwickshire County Council through the Warwickshire Towns Network Programme. The workshops shared insights into how businesses can use social media and other digital tools to grow an online community.

Tina said: "We'd just started to get the business where we wanted it to be after a year and then the pandemic hit. For a fortnight, we just didn't know what we were going to do. We were in shock.

"We both love Coleshill and it was our dream to open a business here and to move here. We had our first date in the town 30 years ago – just over the road from the café – and then went on to get married.

"So, we couldn't stand by and let the business go under, we knew we had to try everything we could to survive and look for all the support we could get.

"I attended three online group sessions with Stories Marketing to help improve my digital skills and then had a one-to-one session and it was really useful.

"I started to understand a bit more of theory Tourism businesses. For more inform behind posting and using things like hashtags. to <u>https://www.cw-chamber.co.uk</u> I suddenly went from a couple of hundred views <u>support/digital-retailer-workshops/</u>

of a post to getting thousands.

"We were very well known in the local community, but more and more people got to know about us and it definitely helped us survive the crisis."

Some of the innovations will continue, despite restrictions being lifted. The Café on the Hill delivered 40 Sunday lunches to customers on a recent weekend and has even ventured into event catering.

Such is the success, they've taken on their first member of staff.

Keely Hancox, from the Coventry and Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce, said: "Tina and Dale have so much personality and they've found a way to make that shine through online.

"They've shown a real fighting spirit to come through the crisis by diversifying and that, coupled with Tina's enhanced digital skills, has seen Café on the Hill become even more popular despite having to close their doors for so much of the past year and a half.

"It's great to see that those skills and those changes are not going to be cast aside now that restrictions are lifted. On the contrary, they are using everything they've learnt over the past 18 months to not only keep going but to get the business growing again."

Warwickshire County Councillor Kam Kaur said: "The pandemic really made an instant difference to how businesses would have to operate and the County Council, along with our partners, offered an extensive range of support. What was key to our thinking was not only in solving the problem to help businesses stay operational but also to enable them to grow and develop beyond the immediate crisis, in the changing market place that the pandemic brought.

"The Café on the Hill is an exemplar of this. We have supported them to broaden their skills base, reach new customers and engage with local residents. I am delighted to see how well they have adapted and grown. This is precisely the kind of outcome that we were looking for and long may their growth and success continue."


A great time was had by all at the Water Orton Covid Volunteers Thank You Afternoon Tea on Saturday 21st August.





Peggy continued to be very active a member of Ladies Probus, Soroptomists, Save the Children, Coleshill Civic Society as well as a Trustee for the Simon Digby Trust.

Craig Tracey's August Update

This is now my second column this summer in the Coleshill Post and since I returned to Parliament last week to listen to many emotive, harrowing and highlymy last one, there has certainly been a lot to update on.

Unfortunately, the biggest news over these past couple of weeks has been the tragic situation in Afghanistan. I know of many brave men and women from my constituency who have served in tours across the country and I have been in touch with some of the families of those who have served. As somebody who is married to a veteran, I know first-hand the sheer amount of strength and bravery it takes to protect civilian lives, Briefly, on the subject of COVID restrictions, some new and rather welcome measures so the dedication of every single individual who has served anywhere in the world never fails to amaze me. They really are the best of us.

I am also acutely aware of the pain, frustration, anger and disappointment so many exservicemen and women and their families have experienced during this latest tragedy, with the US's extremely ill-judged, to say the least, departure from Afghanistan. I therefore wanted to take this chance to make absolutely clear that the incredible sacrifices so many made, such as Coleshill's own James Munday, were not done so in vain and their legacy will never be forgotten. We need to remember that with the UK intervention back in 2001, we were able to make real, life changing differences to so many innocent Afghans caught up in the terrible situation - drug farms were smashed, terror cells broken down including the killing of Osama bin Laden and we helped ensuring girls and women were given a decent education amongst a number of other things. We must never forget this and had we not intervened, things would have turned out very differently. As a veteran himself, the Defence Secretary, Rt Hon Ben Wallace MP, summed the situation up very well, along with the UK Government's response in a recent Sunday Telegraph article which I shared over on my Facebook have concerns or questions, about the above news items or any issue, please page and I would urge everybody to read if they can.

moving speeches from colleagues when it was recalled to debate the situation, and will simply say that we are very lucky indeed to have the perspective of so many Members of Parliament who have served in the region. It is absolutely right that we protect the rights of Afghans fleeing such terrible fates and along with all MPs, I will continue to monitor the ongoing situation extremely closely.

were able to come into force due last week due to 75% of all adults in the UK now being double jabbed, which is just fantastic news. The latest change to self-isolation rules saw the requirement drop for double jabbed people having to self-isolate when coming into close contact with a positive Covid-19 case, so long as they themselves test negative. It is also very welcome that under-18s will also be exempt from this requirement as it will minimise disruption as much as possible for lots of young people, particularly as they head back to classrooms again after the holidays.

Finally, I wanted to say a huge congratulations on a fantastic set of exam results this month. This has certainly been an unprecedented year and I know how hard our young people worked to secure the grades they needed for their futures, so this success was greatly deserved. A massive well done to all who sat their exams this year and also to the teachers who have had to work through extremely challenging circumstances to deliver this outstanding set of results.



Re: Traffic calming measures on Water Orton Road

We are approaching you as a neighbour/resident of Water Orton Road as we, and maybe even yourselves, are become increasingly concerned about the excessive speed of the traffic on WOR along with the continued nuisance of the Quad / Off road bikes. Many of us have signed a petition in the past requesting that they install average speed cameras but the request has gone no-where due to ongoing budget constraints.

A few of us attended the Castle Bromwich Parish Council meeting on 28 July @ Arden Hall to raise our concerns and ask what is being done to tackle the problem. The feedback was that it was not their jurisdiction & that it's down to the Council (Highways dept) & the Police.

The Parish Council did offer to write another letter to the Council to raise the issue on our behalf but their feedback was for those of us who are concerned to also raise it individually. It definitely seems to be a case of 'he who shouts the loudest' will be listened to and so the more of us who raise this as an issue, the better - it really would be great if we could get some traction on this ourselves too. In the meantime, Jacqui Ward (a WOR resident & member of the Parish Council) is championing this for us and has already spoken to Sgt Pugh (Solihull Police) about the issue. In addition, she has contacted Ken Hawkins (Cabinet Member of Highways) and he is now in touch with Martin McCarthy (Solihull Conservative Councillor) and she has also engaged the Birmingham Mail.

Mexican Chicken Fajitas

Ingredients

- 1 red pepper, halved, de-seeded and finely sliced 1 green pepper, halved,
- de-seeded and finely sliced
- 2 medium red onions, halved and finely sliced 2-3 skinless boneless chicken
- breasts, cut into chunks 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp cumin

2 fresh red chillies, de-seeded and finely chopped

- Juice of 1 lime

For the salsa:

- ¹/₂-1 fresh red chilli, de-seeded and finely chopped
- 15 ripe cherry tomatoes, halved
- Small handful of finely chopped coriander
- Juice of 1 lime

Method

- 1. Spray a non-stick pan with low calorie cooking spray and place over a medium-high heat. Add the peppers, onions, chillies, lime juice and spices and stir-fry for 4-5 minutes. Add the chicken, then stir-fry over a high heat for 5 mins until the chicken is cooked.
- 2. Meanwhile, tip the salsa ingredients into a food processor, along with the lime juice and a little seasoning and pulse until finely chopped.
- 3. Lay out the ingredients on a table and serve.

Following recent problems with the telephone system monitoring was carried out and unfortunately, due to the age of system it was beyond repair and by the time you read this a new system will have been installed. The Surgery appreciates that the delay involved in resolving the problem was inconvenient for patients, but they worked as quickly as possible to resolve issue.

The new system should give patients a lot more facilities and information with regard to how many are in the queue before them. Initially a message will be delivered regarding non-urgent contact i.e., obtaining test results or queries. Patients will be asked to call back after 10.30 when the lines are not so busy with 'on the day' appointment booking. Patients will also be directed straight to the POD (Prescription Ordering Direct) on 024 7624 6025 regarding ordering of medication.

The new system has a lot more functionality than the old system and will allow the surgery to monitor the telephone system collating how many incoming calls are being received, how many dropped/missed calls are being experienced and when peak times are. August to September in the Gardens is a remarkably busy time (as always) for our Gardeners. If you visit, look out for them collecting seeds from our perennials and annuals, they will be cleaning the seed to store in a cool dry place ready for sowing at a later date.

The ponds will also be netted ready for the Autumn. Leaves in the ponds leads to a build-up of sludge in the bottom over time. In the vegetable garden they remove any old potatoes that remain in the ground- it is the last chance to do so before the risk of blight sets in.

A general clean-up of all the vegetables will happen by removing any old crops and getting on top of any weeds that are resident. In this transformative time from Summer to Autumn you may spot the first signs of rich, Autumnal colours entering the Gardens. The Beech tree leaves will start to turn first a rich golden colour and then the liquid amber tree turns a lovely shade of crimson.



Platinum Sept Update

Hello, we're back with the second part of our article about wallpapering. Having based the first article on the preparation we can now talk about the actual wallpapering process and provide some tips to help you achieve a more professional finish.

The first thing to do is to make sure you're set up with the right tools. It's worth spending a bit extra on a very good pair of papering scissors and trimming knife. Regarding trimming knives, we recommend using one with snap off blades so the blade can easily be refreshed as soon as it loses it's sharpness. Depending on the paper this can be as often as every couple of cuts. If the blade isn't sharp then it will start snagging on the paper. Please be careful when using your knife and make sure none of the snapped off blades are left lying around. Another important tool is some kind of a straight edge to use as a guide when trimming rather than trying to trim free hand against the ceiling or skirting. Using a straight edge will leave a much neater finish.

Now there's the importance of reading the instructions. Even if you've hung plenty of wallpaper in the past, different papers and manufacturers can recommend different approaches and techniques that if not followed will at best result in a slightly lower quality finish or at worst result in the whole job having to be redone due to a more serious problem. Pay special attention to the recommended soak time. When you apply paste to the paper it expands, the soak time is the amount of time it takes for the paper to stop expanding, this varies for different papers. If you don't let it soak for long enough then it will continue to expand on the wall resulting in bubbles and overlapping seams. (As mentioned in our last article, if it is paste the wall there will be no soak time so you don't need to worry about this)

The next thing to consider is placement of the wallpaper. It's worth spending some time prior to starting working out where you want the seams to fall to avoid having to cut patterns off in awkward places or finding yourself with a very thin strip left to complete a wall or to go round a corner. Also important in the planning stage is working out the placement of the pattern. If the paper features a strong vertical pattern then we always try to centralise that according to dominant features in a room. So if there's a chimney breast or fireplace we will usually line the pattern up in the centre of it. If there is a strong horizontal pattern then we always try to place the paper so that the ceiling line doesn't run through that pattern so that we're not cutting the paper off half way through a flower head or other dominant feature. Once you've worked out where the first drop is going you need to mark a vertical line on the wall using either a spirit level, plumb bob line or a laser level. Don't be tempted to start at a corner on the basis that it looks vertical. Corners of walls in houses are rarely perfectly vertical. Likewise ceiling lines are never perfectly horizontal. If the first drop isn't exactly vertical then neither will the rest of them be.

Next some tips regarding working with different types of pattern. If the paper has an off-set match and you come to measure up the next drop and there's a lot of waste paper to be cut off at the top then it's worth opening other rolls to see if they have less wastage for the next drop.

If you're working with a detailed pattern then there are some circumstances that can lead to the pattern being slightly off. This can be caused by poor quality paper or by paper that has soaked for too long. It can also sometimes be caused by the way the paper is manufactured. This can be the case with Farrow and Ball paper due to the traditional manufacturing process. Their technical department will actually advise you that the pattern may run out for this reason. If you are having problems getting the pattern to match for the whole length of the drop then the best thing to do is to make sure it matches at eye level and allow it to run out towards the floor and/or ceiling.

If the paper is a dark colour it can be trickier to hide the seams due to the light edge of the paper showing slightly or the seam opening up slightly. When working with very dark paper there are 2 things you could do to prevent these issues being a problem. The first thing to do is while the paper is still rolled up, colour the ends of the rolls in with a pencil crayon the same colour as the paper. Some paper manufacturers actually advise this on their labels. The second thing is to get some paint that's the same or a similar shade to the paper and paint vertical stripes on the wall where the seams will be. That way if any seams do open up slightly they won't be noticeable.

Hopefully these tips will help you achieve a better finish when wallpapering but probably the most important thing to remember is to be patient and not rush it.

WOODMAN CORNER

Regular customers of the butchers shop opposite the Red Lion will have heard Bill Spencer (who has now retired) speak of Woodman Corner. Before these shops on the corner were built in about 1970 the area from the shops shown and then round corner onto Parkfield Road were buildings which had been built, probably in the early 1800's



Before the development Parkfield Road was known as Back Lane. The Primary School was the Back Lane School and the house next door was the Headmasters House. You can see why it was called Back Lane! Just before the row of houses was a Wesleyan Chapel



Around the corner Parkfield Road went past some houses up to the end of High Street and the start of Coventry Road. The large building on the left at the top of the row was the Woodman Inn. When this was the inn it stood proudly on the corner and the church can be seen in the distance.

After the inn closed a General store opened on the end of the row of buildings. The long building shown is Dr Wall's Barn which along with the old buildings on the corner were demolished and the new shops and the houses on Parkfield Road built.




The pile of bricks shows all that is left of the old barn and illustrates the large area involved.

Roll the dough into a circle about 1/4" thick. Cut the dough using a 3 inch round cutter. Reform the offcuts, roll to 1/4" thick cutting until you've used all the dough.

Repeat with the other disk of dough.

Heat an dry frying pan over low-medium heat and place the cakes so they do not touch. Fry for 2 1/2 minutes each side until browned and cooked all the way through.

Let the cakes cool on a rack.

Once cooled, dust the cakes with caster sugar.

Serve warm and buttered. A word of warning though, one will never be enough.

Sowing the Seeds of Love

The benefits of and vegetables into our diets are huge. Granted the

supermarkets will satisfy this need and the cost of buying fresh produce is not going to break the bank, but do we know what we are buying?

Beautifully presented and packaged, these foods are not free from chemicals and harmful pesticides. In fact, The Mirror reports that 'experts discovered 66% of over 2,000 samples of fruit and veg analysed had traces of multiple chemicals'. Pesticides have been used, and still are, in agriculture to kill insects and weeds. The Five-A-Day campaign promotes healthy eating by encouraging and advising us to eat more fruit and veg. However, an article into the harmful effects of pesticides by Green Science – musings of a young conservationist states that;

Pesticides are stored in your colon, where they slowly but surely poison the body. You may not realize this, but when you are eating a non-organic apple, you are also eating over 30 different pesticides that have been sprayed on the apple. Even if you wash a piece of fruit, such as an apple, there are still many pesticides lingering on it, and they could have seeped into the fruit or vegetable.

We don't even think about how dangerous these pesticides could be over the long term. Shops don't put up signs and there are no labels on the specific items warning us to be cautious and making us aware of the harm that could be caused. Buying organic fresh foods is probably the best way to go if you are going to continue to shop for these items in supermarkets. Failing that, then please do wash the fruit and vegetables, even organic ones, to remove pesticides and bacteria. According to the CSE (Centre for Science and Environment) this is the correct procedure doing this:

- First wash with 2% of salt water to remove most of the contact pesticide residues that normally appear on the surface of the vegetables and fruits.
- About 75-80% of pesticide reduces are removed by cold water washing and some may require 2 to $3\,$ washings.
- The green leafy vegetables must be washed thoroughly. The pesticide residues from green leafy vegetables can be removed by normal processing such as washing, blanching, and cooking.

We all reach for a piece of fruit and bite into it without thinking about washing it first. It's not something we have been educated or informed about, but it is a small price to pay for making sure we are helping ourselves and our families to eat that little bit more healthily.

You know, some of us might still fret or worry about what we are buying. So why not have a go at growing your own? Of course, it is not possible to grow everything but there are many fruits and vegetables which are very easy to cultivate in a plot of your own. Just imagine popping out and coming back with armfuls of freshly grown organic foods? For me, there's something about planting those

tiny seeds and watching the little green shoots appear out of the darkness of the compost that is so satisfying and rewarding.

incorporating fresh fruit The biggest obstacle is probably going to be lack of space. Not everyone is lucky enough to have a back garden with an area specifically dedicated to fruit and vegetables. Don't let this stop you though! Of course, the best option would be to acquire an allotment. This is not as arduous a task as you might think. In fact, the only thing needed to get you going is the initial want. Having made up your mind that an allotment is just what you could do with, the next step is to find out where your local allotments are based. Go along, have a look around, and speak to the person in charge. Prices are affordable at around £93 per annum and £48 if you're over 65 but may vary from council to council. However, all are reasonable. Alternatively, you can visit the Birmingham City Council website for more information https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/allotments. Most allotments will have equipment available for hire such as rotavators and strimmers as well as a selection of products that are safe to use. You can pick up slug pellets, weed killer and compost as and when you need it.

> So now you have an allotment! Just think of all the good it can do for you in the future. Apart from plenty of fresh, delicious, and picked-onthe-spot fruits and vegetables, there are other benefits too.

- It's a great way to get plenty of exercise. From the clearing process to planting all your seeds, it's the perfect way to keep fit.
- Your allotment and the food you produce will reduce your carbon footprint so it's good for the environment.
- Children love getting involved too and what a fantastic way to teach them about growing plants from seed. Get them planting, weeding, and watering and help them to learn more about nature.
- Allotments offer a chance to build relationships. No doubt you will make many new friends with your neighbouring allotment owners. Most are very friendly and happy to offer tips and advice while it's also great to swap produce too.

Of course, we cannot forget the joy of bringing home fresh fruits and vegetables. They taste so much better when you have picked them yourself.

I hope this will encourage you to go out and do some planting of your own. Crops, don't forget, can also be grown in containers on balconies, on the patio or a small space in your garden. There are many ways to enjoy the delights of home-grown produce. So, what are you waiting for? Sow those seeds of love and watch them grow!
