



Community Growing

Laura Docker took on her first allotment plot in April 2021, and now has a large double plot in Coleshill, Warwickshire, where she grows a variety of vegetables and flowers. In 2021, Laura won "Best Newcomer" at the North Warwickshire Allotment Federation awards, and in 2023 was awarded "Best Allotment" by Coleshill Town Council.

Tropaeolum majus, widely known as nasturtiums, might be considered by some as the marmite of the gardening world but personally I love them! These versatile flowers come in a variety of beautiful colours, and they flower from summer to late autumn, producing masses of brightly coloured blooms.

In my opinion, their greatest characteristic is that they are an excellent companion plant at the allotment. Nasturtiums attract bees as well as drawing away pesky white cabbage butterflies from brassicas, and blackfly from beans! For this reason, I scatter seeds around my allotment and allow them to self-seed. Whilst I don't

mind allowing them free reign on my plot, they do tend to spread far and wide if left to their own devices, so you might wish to keep an eye on the seeds as they drop. I regularly have to relocate seedlings when they appear in paths during late spring and early summer.

I have actually only ever sown nasturtium seeds once at my allotment, and that was during my first season, back in 2021. All of the flowers you see this year have self-seeded from that first year! This is another reason I love them – free plants, year on year. I just relocate any which grow outside of the beds – they even grow on my compost bays, making them look pretty for a few months of the year.

Nasturtiums are not only attractive and

helpful companion plants, but they are also fully edible! The unripe seed pods can be pickled and used in place of capers, leaves can be used to make pesto, and the flowers can be added to salads for that 'wow' factor. The plant has a slightly peppery taste, and the leaves are best eaten when young.

Here are a couple of really simple, tasty ways to start using nasturtiums in the kitchen.

Nasturtium Pesto

- 1 cup of nasturtium leaves
- ½ cup olive oil
- ¼ cup pine nuts
- 1 large garlic clove peeled and chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1. Wash and dry the leaves

- 2. Toast the pine nuts in a saucepan over a low heat until lightly browned
- 3. Add all ingredients to a food processor and whizz until smooth
- 4. Spoon into a clean, sterilised jar (store for up to 10 days)

Summer Salad

- Handful of young nasturtium leaves
- 12 whole nasturtium flowers (remove stems)
- Handful of rocket or other lettuce
- Sliced beetroot
- Spring onions
- Feta cheese
- Add your dressing of choice





The Story of Castle Bromwich Parish Church (pt12)

I very much hope that my enthusiasm will be enough to convey what I feel is the sheer audacity of the work that was done to the old chapel of St. Mary at Castle Bromwich between 1726 and 1731.

We think that this complete encasement is totally unique in the British Isles – and perhaps in the world. I would be glad to know if any reader knows of another church which has within its outer walls, a Norman stone chapel and the full timber framework of a medieval nave including all the roof trusses.

It is an absolute privilege to have such a fascinating building to preserve for day to day use, not as an ancient monument, but it is so frustrating that there is no positive knowledge of who conceived the essence of the scheme.

The first two Bridgeman Lords of the manor, both Sir John, were great builders and both had forceful wives who were involved in their projects but no known record exists of the considerable debate that must have taken place to prepare for a scheme so complicated as this encasement.

The Bridgeman papers in Staffordshire Archives contain many orders and bills for building materials in quantity but no documents with evidence of design thought processes or any indication of the modus operandii for the work.

I am following up some "leads" from the County Archivist but we should bear in mind that we are discussing a project which, if carried out today, would cost several million pounds. The work was of considerable complexity but was carried out by a "provincial" labour force with no modern equipment. All the scaffolding, of which there would have been a large quantity, would have been long poles of ash, alder and possibly pine, standing in timber barrels packed with sand, fastened together with rope lashings. It would have been the despair of a modern Health & Safety Inspector! The work started in 1724 with the demolition of the old

The work started in 1724 with the demolition of the old steeple and the erection a new, classical style tower, set well away from the end of the existing half-timbered chapel. The new tower was possibly to the design of a Worcestershire stonemason with, supposedly, Sir Christopher Wren as his mentor!

There is, in the church records, a Treatise written by an architectural student in 1986, which includes a copy of "Articles of Agreement" referring to the new tower being built "according to the form and module thereof hereunto annexed" which may refer to either a drawing or a model and mentioning the name of Thomas White, the mason. I have queried the

whereabouts of the original of this document which was probably drawn up by a lawyer in beautiful "copperplate" script.


There is also a comment in this Treatise, which I suspect was made by the Rector of our parish in 1986, Canon W E Brooke MA, who had visited the Bridgeman archives when they were at Weston Park and obtained the copy "Articles"

He states that "the form and module annexed to the copy was a crude elevation – untypical of White when compared with his very competently drafted designs for

monuments in Blodwel Church."

It seems to me that this was therefore probably a sketch copy done by whoever copied the original Articles. Just another "dead end" in our search for the true author of this impressive exercise.

Water Orton Road safety improvement scheme commences

Following the period of consultation undertaken on Water Orton Road we can confirm that 14 representations were received of which all were supportive of the proposals with 13 of those 14 respondents raising concerns in addition to their support. It is noted however that no outright objections were received. The representations have been considered and responded to by council officers and a decision taken to proceed.

A start date for works has now been agreed with the contractor. Works should commence on Monday 22nd July 2024 and is programmed to last 6 weeks until Friday 30th August 2024. In order for the work to be carried out safely, temporary multi-way traffic lights will be in place for the period of work with resurfacing works taking place under phased road closures which are due to take place between Monday 19th August 2024 and Friday 30th August 2024. It is worth noting that some of the work aspects are weather dependant and therefore the dates are subject to change. We will however endeavour to keep you updated if those dates change and particularly the planned surfacing dates.

SMBC Officers have dropped letters to affected frontages from Monday (15th July 2024) to share the above details ahead of works beginning. Advance notice signs will also be placed on site early next week to inform motorists and road users that works will be starting on site on Monday 22nd July.


Throughout August we are open 6 days a week – Tuesdays to Sundays, 10.30 - 4.30pm



Until Frankie Elkin - missing persons specialist - comes to town. Fresh off her case in Boston, Frankie heads to Wyoming, determined to find Timothy and bring him home - whatever the cost. 
The misadventures of Margaret Finch by Claire McGlasson





The blackhouse by Peter May

News from St Clement of Alexandria Green Lane, Castle Bromwich (known locally as St Clements Church)



"Listening is being able to be changed by the other person." – Alan Alda.

When both church organs decided to stop working it became time for the piano that had sat in the corner for some years to take centre stage, but before doing so it needed tuning. It turned out it wasn't as bad as we had at first thought, although we were informed this beautiful instrument should be tuned every year - who knew! So it's now in the Church diary for 2025. That old piano sitting in the corner was in fact a John Broadwood & Sons who are the oldest piano manufacturer in the world and still have the royal 'By Appointment' warrant. They are the only maker whose story spans the entire history of the British piano, from the experimental beginnings in the 18th century right up to the present day. Sometimes we do not always see what is in front of us and just take for granted things around us, so on taking a closer inspection the inscription inside the lid reads, "John Broadwood & Sons Ltd London estd 1728 By Appointment makers To The British Sovereigns from George 11 to Edward V11". Two hundred years ago Ludwig van Beethoven received the gift of a Broadwood grand piano. This instrument, now known as Beethoven's Broadwood, was much loved by the composer and is said to have inspired most of his late piano sonatas. Beethoven's Broadwood piano is now displayed in a museum in Budapest, Hungary.

Although our piano still needs a bit of TLC our organist Chris Budd for the time being, plays it during the services and my goodness really makes it "sing" and even his son William who is learning to play treated us to his playing during one of our recent services. Some weeks ago we celebrated the Admission of the Churchwardens at St Clements and received some lovely comments on behalf of Chris. When the organs "went down" during a service no panic, Chris just moved seats and carried on playing

and together with the guitarist we all without a pause just **Purple poppy:** Honors animals that served in wars. carried on singing!

The Poppy is a symbol of Remembrance and the group has played its part in previous years in the making of knitted poppies for the War Memorial in the Village which Castle Bromwich Parish Council dresses each year with the help of Sarah from Manor Park Brides.

Red poppy: The traditional symbol of remembrance for those who died in World War 1 and subsequent conflicts.

Black poppy: Represents Black, African, and Caribbean communities who contributed to the war effort.

White poppy: Associated with peace and an alternative to the red poppy.

The year goes quickly so planning is everything and although November does seem a long way off, many knitted poppies will be needed to decorate the War Memorial, so with needles at the ready, let's see how many we can make.





Fitness and Wellbeing

Hi All, It seems that most of this summer so far, we have all been suffering with the glum weather blues. The lack of sunny days can demotivate a huge amount of the population. Exercise in any form is a great way to counteract this and kick off those natural endorphins. (as I write this it is still raining, by the time you are reading it in print it will probably be blazing hot- at least I hope so.)

There are so many local venues and classes available to go to, but often the getting to them is the hardest part. You may be a young parent without childcare or someone who doesn't have access to transport- but often it is merely the thought of going to an 'exercise class' or a 'gym' that puts you off. If it is that, then it is easier than ever now to do a little bit at home to get you started. I should also say before you do start that a lot of the advice on social media should be taken with caution, and if you have any injuries/illnesses etc please



those 'plank/squat/burpee' etc challenges that you often see people posting online about, but there are also relatively cheap pieces of equipment that are easy to store and can help you get started, without spending a fortune.


I thought this month I would do a bit of an intro to one of the popular pieces of equipment you can find easily and get a great workout from - 'kettlebells'.

You often see them in the middle aisle of Aldi, or used to see them on the old retro strongman pictures, but what are they really about?

They have been around since the 18th century and were originally used to weigh crops, then a century later became popular with strongmen performers.



Modern day kettlebells can be made of plastic filled with sand or cast iron and start from as small as 0.5kg, so there is a weight to suit every level. The idea is that unlike a dumbbell the centre of gravity is below the hand so they work well for swinging movements and are easier to grip for certain exercises. You hold them for most movements by the handle at the top, or sometimes by 'the horns' (when the handle meets the main weight section or 'bell').



A simple kettlebell swing works throughout the whole body in one movement and you just increase the amount you do, or the weight you use as you improve. The movement is performed by holding the kettlebell by the handle with both hands, bend the legs slightly with the weight hanging down in front of you towards the floor. Then you simply swing it forward to shoulder height (still holding with both hands and straightening the legs to standing position, then as the weight comes back down you bend the legs again to return to the original position).

It's not the easiest one to explain in writing, so a quick google will show you lots of videos on the correct technique for this and other exercises you can use them for. Alternatively you can attend a class (there are regular ones in Coleshill) and learn the basics with an instructor to help. In a class you will usually perform a warm-up (without the weights) and then go through a series of exercises with the bells, varying the weight to your level. As the moves are simple there is no complicated choreography you would get in some other fitness classes, it is all about getting the technique right.

Oscar Jackson, who teaches kettlebell classes said "Kettlebells are great for your overall strength and core strength too.

My kettlebell classes are designed to be fun, work your whole body and build strength and cardiovascular endurance all into once session"

The benefits of weights for exercise, particularly as you get older are huge, so buying one of these on your next shopping trip may be a great way to add a bit of strength training to your day without needing a lot of space. If you are a total beginner depending on your fitness level etc you can but a 2/2.5kg and work upwards. Some retailers sell fabric versions that you can fill with sand to keep increasing the weight, or adjustable ones that cover a selection of weights by taking sections on and off. These work great if you only have space for one and want to be able to adapt.

Whichever style you choose, they can all give a complete cardio and strength workout in each session. There are lots of plans on Youtube and other social media sites you can use to get you started. If you do a 30 second to 60 second set of each exercise it should help with mobility, flexibility, strength and cardiac fitness if performed correctly regularly.



The former Paratrooper and ex RAF Reservist had to wade through muddy ankle high waterlogged footpaths, completing the following disciplines.

7 km (40 lb), 16 km mountain biking (40 lb backpack), 11 km (40lb backpack) totalling 34 km in an overall combined time of 3 hrs. 38

Doyle was paced and monitored to every checkpoint by the support team who were responsible for taking action photos, film evidence, some of the permanent footpaths was thick in clay, but the team made sure he stayed on time from start to finish.

"to be honest I was under a lot of pressure as the previous weather conditions made the cross country course tough to negotiate, my legs were tired on the 11 km speed march, but the support team were pushing me all the way."

Doyle still had to maintain his fitness levels, because ten days later he attempted 8 short course kayak challenges, carrying 35lbs of instructor expedition kit along the River Leam Royal Leamington Spa, the finishing times were. 2.5 miles - 38 min. 32 sec. 3.5 miles -50 min. 18 sec . 4.5 miles - 1 hr. 02 min. 59 sec. 5.5 miles - 1 hr. 17

6.5 miles - 1 hr. 30 min. 19 sec. 7 miles - 1 hr. 38 min. 12 sec. 7.5 miles - 1 hr. 45 min. 05 sec. 8 miles - 1 hr. 52 min. 28 sec. Beating

the cut off time by 8 min. 32 sec, increasing his career fitness endurance challenges and world records to 858.

"the support along the bank side of the River Leam helped a lot from the walkers who clapped and encouraged me, including the support team who made sure my paddling strokes were quick and fast, it has been a tough ten days mentally and physically but I recover quick and I am ready for my next endurance attempt." Currently Doyle is well ahead of the Scottish endurance Athlete William Cannon who has 650 World Records and rated by the Scottish press as Britain's Fittest Man. Cannon said in 2021 that he wanted to achieve 1000 strength challenges and World Records, so the race is on for Paddy Doyle and team to get there first, if Doyle stays on target he will be the first GB endurance athlete globally to of reached 1000 fitness endurance challenges and World Records spanning eleven different sporting categories.


