'When the theatres closed in March 2020, I had no work, no income and no creative output, so I joined Studley's local isolation support group as a phone contact for vulnerable members of the community. Having been trapping in my own home for 6 months in 2015 following a near fatal car crash, and knowing how difficult that was, I realised that there was something else I could do to help my local community'

And from that moment 'Aunty Jen' was born! Jen spent 107 days during the first lockdown delivering stories for children and comedy monologues for adults all recorded from her garden shed!

When the country came out of lockdown in the summer of 2020, Studley residents asked Aunty Jen if there was anything she could do to bring the community back together.

As far as they are aware, Aunty Jen Productions was the second company in the whole country to go back live on stage with their socially distanced production of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'

Since then, the company have produced 29 live events including pantomimes, family shows, Shakespeare for School's and Murder Mysteries and have managed to raise over £4000 for charity along the way.

'It's been an incredible journey' says Jen 'I couldn't have imagined when I first sat in my shed everything that we have achieved in the last five years! Everyone in Coleshill, at the Council and in the town has been so supportive, we simply cannot wait to entertain you all!'

And with plans for a pantomime performance at the hall in 2026, AJP are hoping to become a firm theatrical favourite with local residents.

### **Coleshill ringers celebrated VE Day**

Coleshill ringers joined others around the world on 8 May when bells rang out in celebration of the end of the European war, and in memory of those never to return and their families.

Ringers' national body, The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, had asked ringers to ring their bells at 6.30pm.

Coleshill ringers returned at 9pm to call the town to the croft to witness one of over 1000 beacons lit around the UK. The illuminated tower and spire provided a spectacular backdrop.

Ringing registers for 1938-48 show that the then ringers rang at 3.15pm on VE Day, 8.30pm the following day, rang a peal the next at 3pm, and rang for a victory service at 4pm on the 13th.

VJ Day was celebrated three times on 15 August - at 9.30am, 11am, and 7.30pm.

The Council is the representative body for all who ring bells in the English tradition with rope and wheel. Founded in 1891, it represents 65 affiliated societies, which cover all parts of the British Isles and centres of ringing in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, the USA, South Africa and Italy. They comprise the members of the local companies of ringers in their areas.

You could be part of that tradition. The object of the Council is to advance the practice, heritage and appreciation of bell ringing as an enjoyable mental and physical exercise and unique performing art for the public benefit of both church and community.

Coleshill ringers practise from 7.30pm each Tuesday. For a try out, call in: there's no need to book.

### Cllr Martin McCarthy, Castle Bromwich Ward (Solihull MBC) June update

Welcome to glorious June in Castle Bromwich, we have had a rather dry spring leaving our gardens a little parched. Saving kitchen wastewater for these can be a big help for your favourite plants and keep our area looking beautiful.

#### Planning and building

At the end of April four Castle Bromwich house extension plans came before the SMBC Planning committee, three within, Hawthorne road, Farnworth Grove and Woodford avenue were rejected as Members considered that these failed to satisfy Policies within P15 of the Solihull Local Plan promoting quality of place. The main reason for this refusal was poor design detrimental to neighbours and the overall street scene.

The result is good for Castle Bromwich. Although developers can appeal.

The fourth in Tackford Close received conditional approval.

Work Continues on developing the Castle Bromwich local plan to help protect the Character and quality of our area.

#### How does planning work?

There are local and national laws governing planning, from small extensions right up to major developments and civil infrastructure like roads and airports. Planning officers use those rules to recommend whether a development should be allowed or not. The process is "quasi-judicial" meaning that it is rooted in law rather than opinion. Officers can make a decision based on delegated authority, but sometimes developments will need to go to the planning committee and be decided by councillors. This might be because of the scale or number of objections. Councillors will then decide whether to accept or refuse what officers recommend. If they do not accept, they must give a material reason why that will hold up at any appeal.

### How do I make a comment or objection?

You can find any application simply by going online and searching "Solihull Council Planning". This should take you to the public access area. Input the address that you need and you can view drawings, plans

and make comments. You will need to

#### create an account to do this however. Who makes the decision and how does it work?

Most applications are small and are determined by Planning officers using what is known as Delegated Authority. This could be anything from building garden walls to pruning trees or even putting up signs. However, larger applications such as big housing developments are required to go to the Planning Committee for elected councillors to decide. Any application that receives six or more objections must also go to Planning Committee. Every date the committee meets, as well as the agenda and minutes of previous meetings are on the SMBC website. All meetings are live streamed for all to see and recorded.

#### There is a development that affects me. What can I do?

The most important thing is to make a comment on the application. If you know others are affected, encourage them to comment too. Comments DO make a difference!

You can register to speak by emailing pcspeaking@solihull.gov.uk. You can do this as a neighbour, resident or on behalf of a group. You will be limited on how long you can speak for. It's important to keep it relevant to planning laws to be effective.

You can also contact your local councillor to ask if they would be willing to speak. Planning Committee members cannot express any opinion that might indicate they have made up their mind in advance, so do check which councillors are on the committee.

Do what you can to ensure an application goes to Planning Committee, as it can then be decided by elected members.

#### I Don't Like an Application and I Objected. Why was it Allowed Anyway?

Unfortunately, there sometimes no material reasons in planning law to reject something. The most important thing is to prove a development will cause more harm than good. There are many ways to do this and your local councillor can give you advice on this. It's worth observing Planning Committee meetings as they give great detail on how decisions are made.

#### School parking issues

Parking in front of private drives blocks emergency access and causes considerable offence to property owners. It is frequently one vehicle after another.

Those parking there should consider whether they would be happy to have such parking blocking their own drives and park with care.

#### Tree replacement

There used to be 2 trees on the verge outside Castle Bromwich Infant School which have both been lost.

3 Trees will be planted there by SMBC Contractors from Nov 25, do you know of any missing trees in your area ? let's see if we can get them on the list for this years winter planting season.

#### Regular Councillor Surgery at Castle Bromwich Library.

election, I am honoured to have been elected as County Councillor for Coleshill North and Water Orton. This electoral ward also includes Curdworth, Lea Marston, Marston and Wishaw, and you may be assured that all component parts of the electoral ward are of equal importance to me. I aim to represent all residents within those ward communities, and act as a bridge to the county council, communicating residents concerns, and hopefully resolving reported situations. If you didn't vote Reform at the recent election, or if you didn't vote at all, perhaps there may be some consolation in the fact that I do at least live firmly within the electoral ward, off Temple Way in Coleshill, so I know the ward geography (knowledge refreshed from recent leafletting exercise), and believe I have a good grasp of what is happening locally.

The chances are that I've experienced the same road closures, traffic delays, pollution and potholes as you have, and that I share the majority view on developments that have impacted and continue to impact the local landscape.

#### About Me

I'm 52 years old, married with two children, who are currently going through their respective educational stages, having both firstly attended High Meadow Community School. I live in an ordinary semi-detached house on an ordinary estate, and I've had some ordinary occupations - I'm not a career politician, nor am I a self-aggrandiser or point-scorer. I am genuinely interested in what happens within the community around me, to the extent that I've volunteered for a number of years with a local youth organisation, and a nearby swimming club. I also hosted a Ukrainian refugee, under the Homes For Ukraine scheme. I'm approachable, and always prepared to listen. I take a common sense approach to problem solving, and try to uphold the values instilled from my upbringing.

### Following the recent County CouncilWhat has happened since theelection, I am honoured to haveelection?

On 5th and 6th May, I attended induction sessions at Shire Hall, Warwick, along with other North Warwickshire and Bedworth new Reform councillors, with whom I'm working as part of a team. The sessions introduced us to senior Council personnel, and we learned more about their individual portfolio responsibilities, and focused on governance/constitution/procedure etc. Follow-up training was carried out on 12th May.

The annual general Warwickshire County Council meeting took place on 16th May, where the composition of the council was determined, and individual committee responsibilities were agreed.

The following day, North Warks Reform councillors attended an internal party summit in London.

On 21st May I attended the Coleshill Town Council meeting, with a Parish Council meeting due to be attended on 29th May.

#### **Going Forward**

I am looking into arranging surgeries in each of the above localities, where residents can make their concerns known. It would be preferable to make the timings of these more widely accessible to working people, where possible to do so. Feedback on this would be most welcome, via email robertnealeaitkenhead@warwickshire. gov.uk. I will try to respond in a timely manner.

I aim to quickly acknowledge all new issues raised following my appointment, and will seek to log and progress these with the relevant council personnel without delay. Your patience will be appreciated as I establish myself in the role. Updates may be issued via various channels, as residents will doubtless have their own individual communication preferences!

#### Rachel Taylor MP, North Warwickshire and Bedworth VE Day across North Warwickshire and Bedworth

This month, I attended events to mark the 80th anniversary of VE Day across North Warwickshire and Bedworth. These were some of the most poignant and meaningful community events I have experienced since being elected last year as your MP.

From Bedworth's moving wreath-laying ceremony to the heartfelt community gatherings I attended in Fillongley, Coleshill and Water Orton, the spirit of remembrance from people of all ages who attended stands testament to the enduring power of memory and gratitude in our community.

VE Day stands as a vital reminder of the sacrifices made by those who fought for our freedom, many of whom paid the ultimate price. This year's 80th anniversary was especially significant, as there are sadly fewer and fewer veterans still with us from the war era. Their courage must never be forgotten, and we all have a responsibility to keep these stories alive — to remind ourselves not only of the immense sacrifices made, but the values that led people to make them. As we marked VE Day this year, I could not help but reflect on the echoes of history we are seeing in Ukraine's fight for freedom against Russian tyranny. I know I share the national pride felt by so many that the UK has stood firm in support of our Ukrainian allies. I have been proud of

the generosity shown by the British public in hosting Ukrainian refugees, opening their homes and their hearts to those fleeing war.

Later this year I am looking forward to playing my own small part in supporting Ukraine in their hour of need, when I will be driving an ambulance full of humanitarian supplies to the Ukrainian border as part of a fundraising effort organised by local employer LKQ Euro Car Parts. As I do so, I will be thinking of those World War II veterans from our community, and the immense mix of duty, fear, and honour they felt when fighting for our country, as those on the Ukrainian front lines must be feeling today.

As a constituency MP, I am privileged to see the very best of our community on an almost daily basis at community events like the ones I have attended this month — where community leaders work tirelessly to bring people together over jacket potatoes at Water Orton's legendary Spud Club, or fantastic fireworks in Fillongley, so we can remind each other of the values we all share.

In divided times, the voices of those who hurl abuse over social media can sometimes appear louder than the kind words we share at community events, at the school gates, or when we pass our neighbours in the street. As we approach a century since peace and freedom was secured in Europe, it is vital that we continue to reflect on the ties that bind us, so we can ensure that the spirit of VE Day lives on in our community. And one more thing... I am really pleased that I haven't been receiving further complaints of sporadic opening hours and poor service at the One Stop Post Office counter on Coleshill High Street, after the public meeting I called where One Stop and the Post Office committed to improvements. I am also pleased that they have now installed a Post Box in the shop. I continue to monitor their performance, so please get in touch if you experience problems.

I am holding a coffee morning at the Coleshill Community Centre on 28 June between 10am and midday. Please do come along, and I look forward to seeing some of you there.

### **Public Spaces Protection Order dedicated** to tackling anti-social behaviour approved by North Warwickshire Borough Council

The Police in Atherstone have been given new powers to tackle drink and drug-fuelled anti-social behaviour, after an increase in incidents in the town. The work is supported by the North Warwickshire Community Safety Partnership in helping to make North Warwickshire a safer place to live.

Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO's), introduced in 2014, sit amongst a broad range of powers and tools to help tackle anti-social behaviour locally.

PSPO's are aimed at ensuring public spaces can be enjoyed free from anti-social behaviour. They are not about stopping the responsible use of the night-time economy; however, they do provide councils with another instrument to help deal with persistent issues that are damaging their communities.

North Warwickshire Borough Council approved a three-year Public Space Protection Order in Atherstone that gives both police and authorised council officers extra powers to quickly deal with people

behaving anti-socially.

The PSPO makes it a criminal offence to refuse to surrender alcohol or intoxicating substances such as nitrous oxide, or to refuse an instruction to leave the designated area for a set period. Offenders could face arrest or a fine of up to £1000.

The move has been welcomed by businesses in the town centre after complaints about adults drinking in various locations and causing ASB.

Signage went up over the weekend of the 26-27 April 2025, and the public response so far has been positive.

Councillor Ray Jarvis, Chair of the North Warwickshire Community Safety Partnership, said, "It's come as a request from the police. It's about reassuring the public and confirming ASB will not be tolerated in the town'

PCSO Gavin Scott said, "It is pleasing to see that this new order will enable our policing teams to direct people to leave if they are causing anti-social behaviour which is having a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the community."

### **The Cheesy Tablet Trick**

Our Izzy, a seven-year-old ex-racing greyhound, hasn't been feeling too well lately. It's always hard when one of our dogs is under the weather — if you're going through it at the moment, my heart goes out to you.

Poorly dogs often need medication, and that can be a challenge in itself, especially if you're living with a tablet detective. This morning, as I was preparing Izzy's meds, I went back to a little trick we've used many times over the years — the Cheese Ball Trick.

Now don't get me wrong, there's always one who'll figure it out no matter what, but this has worked with many of our greyhounds over the years, and for lots of the families I work with too. Here's how it goes:

Choose something soft and smelly — cheddar is my go-to.

If you're using cheddar, slice a bit off the block and pop it in the microwave for about 10 seconds. This softens the texture, changes how it smells (which really helps – dogs' noses are incredible), and makes it easier to shape into little treat-sized balls.

Then – it's a numbers game!

If your dog needs one tablet, prep three little balls of food.

If they need two tablets, prep five balls.

Hide the tablet in ball number two (or in balls two and four if there are two tablets). Turn it into a quick little game — feed the balls one after the other with no time for suspicion. Freddie, our three-year-old rescue whippet, is our first dog who would probably eat tablets straight from the packet — if you've got one like that, brilliant, much easier! But Izzy is much more of a detective. That said, with this method, she took her meds like a star this morning.

It's a small trick, but a handy one and in moments like these, anything that helps keep things stress-free is worth sharing.

### Labour government delivering for UK business and workers across the West Midlands through UK-EU Summit

- The Labour Government was elected with a clear mandate to strengthen our relationship with the EU as one of our closest trading partners and geographic allies.
- On the 19th May the Prime Minister will welcome Presidents Von Der Leyen and Costa to London for the first ever Summit between the UK and the EU, to agree a new 'strategic partnership' improving our collective action on safety, security and the economy.
- The Prime Minister is determined to reduce the regulatory burden faced by local businesses when they import and export goods to and from the EU.

Rachel Taylor MP, Labour MP for North Warwickshire and Bedworth and Labour's Mission Champion for the West Midlands has today welcomed the summit 'for a safer, more secure, and more prosperous UK'.

In this summit, the Government is seeking to reduce trade barriers with the EU - the UK's biggest trading partner - something businesses have been crying out for. This will help businesses, grow the economy and boost living standards.

A recent study from the Centre for Economic Performance at the LSE estimated that by the end of 2022, EU exit and associated red tape caused around 16,000 firms (or 14% of EU exporters) to stop exporting to the EU. The UK's agri-food trade with the EU fell between 2018 to 2024, by 21% for exports and 7% for imports.

Most recently, 12 British retailers including M&S, Sainsburys and Morrisons signed a letter calling on the EU and UK to agree a deal to help smooth exports of plant and animal products across the channel.

Removing barriers to trade could boost the economy in the West Midlands, with businesses like Pepsico in Coventry, 2 Sisters Group in Birmingham and West Bromwich, and Muller Holding Group in Shropshire benefitting from easier importing and exporting to the continent.

MP Rachel Taylor says "I know from speaking to exporters across the West Midlands that the status quo is clearly not working – lorries are delayed at borders and businesses are facing an avalanche of red tape to import or export with our nearest neighbours.

"While larger businesses struggle on, the sad truth is that many smaller businesses have simply stopped trying. Things have got to change.

"The UK-EU strategic partnership will deliver for local businesses across the West Midlands, cutting the red tape, boosting growth, and putting money back in people's pockets.

"Labour is negotiating hard in the UK's national interest, and that will deliver for the West Midlands as part of our Plan for Change."

The Summit follows earlier negotiations between Minister for EU Relations, Nick Thomas-Symonds, his opposite number European Commissioner Maroš Šefčovič and between UK and EU officials.

The summit will also focus on two other key areas - safety and security. Negotiations are ongoing and the Government will only agree on a package that meets the needs of working people and business, without compromising on our red lines. This means no return to the customs union, no return to freedom of movement, and no re-joining the single market.





#### HIEF EXECUT **Striking a Caring Chord: Brad Kella Urges More People to Foster in New Film** for Foster Care Fortnight **LAYORS OF THE R**

A powerful new video featuring The Piano 2024 winner Brad Kella has been released as part of a national campaign by the Fairer Fostering Partnership - a group of charitable and not-for-profit fostering organisations - to highlight the urgent need for more foster carers across the UK.

New Routes Fostering, a proud member of the Partnership, is sharing the film locally to encourage more people in the West Midlands to consider fostering and make a difference to the lives of children and young people.

Brad, a self-taught pianist from Liverpool, was placed in foster care at the age of seven. Now, through this film, he's telling his story to help others understand just how life-changing foster care can be.

"If I didn't have my foster parents in my life, it would have been so easy for me to go down the wrong path," Brad said. "I would not be where I am today."

"The impact that fostering's had on my life – I can't even put it into words. If you're out there thinking about fostering a child, don't think about it – just do it. Because you're not just making an impact for that child, you're making a massive impact for the society around you."

The campaign launches during Foster Care Fortnight (12–25 May 2025), as the UK foster care system faces unprecedented pressure. There are now 104,358 children in care away from home, with 68,000 living with around 52,000 foster families - two-thirds of all children in care. But the number of carers is not keeping pace with growing need.

A child comes into care every 20 minutes – and without enough foster carers children are often placed far from school, friends and community.

Joanne Walthew, New Routes Manager, says "We urgently need more foster carers in the West Midlands area to ensure that children and young people stay connected to those people and places that are important and familiar to them."

The video is a powerful reminder of the difference fostering can make – not just to one child, but to families, communities, and wider society.



Firstly, I paid a very emotional visit to the Marie Curie Hospice in Solihull. As you'll be aware by now, the gardens at the hospice were the inspiration for my design and where many of the plants will be donated after the show. The hospice is where my mum, Marie, passed away after battling cancer in June 2014, and I found so much solace in the gardens and the serenity of the space there has never left me. It has been important to me to visit the volunteer gardening team there to say thank you for the part they played in helping my family and I find some peace during our time there and in the moments after mum passed away.



I was shown around the gardens by the wonderful Do and introduced to another 3 of the 20 strong volunteer team. The gardens have changed and grown quite a bit in the years that have passed, but the sense of tranquillity and connection to nature is still just as strong. I was reminded of the joyous amount of garden 'trinkets' – ornamental frogs, ducks and signs – dotted throughout the gardens. There is now also a children's fairy garden, to support young children who are visiting parents and relatives at the hospice, and it is the most magical space. This element is something I have decided to add to my garden, and I am happy to be displaying some wonderful work of a couple of small businesses on my border to mirror these beautiful touches.

Another wonderful meeting was with the wonderful local, family-owned business Planters Garden Centre in Tamworth, who have agreed to sponsor the border and provide the plants! I have been buying from this garden centre for years, so this is very exciting for me, and I can't wait to work with them on this project. It's always lovely to work with small family-run businesses, especially local ones where possible, so I'm really honoured that this father/daughter team are going to help bring my vision to life. Beth and Adrian from Planters have helped to settle my pre event nerves, and I can't wait to show off all of their beautiful plants on the border. It's hard to believe that the build is only a couple of weeks away now!



One of the flowers that will be on the border from my 'wish list' is Salvia (ornamental sage). This is a plant I have in my garden at home, as well as at the allotment, and I love it, so it absolutely had to be on my list of plants for the border! When I delved in to the meaning and symbolism behind salvias, I found that the are symbolic of wisdom, healing and immortality. The blue flowers mean 'thinking of you' and red means 'forever mine'. On a more practical level, salvias are a low maintenance plant which are easy to grow. These beautiful blooms enjoy well-drained beds in a sunny spot and are loved by bees and butterflies. You can also take cuttings to get extra plants, and believe me – you will want extra salvias!


#### Three women and a boat by Anne Youngson


#### Wrong place, wrong time by Gillian McAllister





A councillor's role can include developing strategies and plans for the area, helping with problems and ideas, representing the community, working with other local community groups, decision making and reviewing decisions and talking to the community about their needs and what the council is doing.

#### How to become a councillor

A Parish Council can only be as helpful, connected and energetic as the people elected to run them, so we need councillors capable, enthusiastic and engaged to reflect their communities. There are three ways that you can become a councillor; standing for election, filling a vacant seat after an election (co-opted) or filling a casual vacancy. 
