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HS2 Tunnel Portal Appeal and Odour Update

My apologies for my absence from the Post over the last few months. Hopefully this article will bring you up to date with key local HS2 matters for Water Orton and our neighbouring communities

Legal Action against HS2.

In short North Warwickshire borough council has taken legal action about hs2's decision to build the eastern tunnel portal in Water Orton; In the original HS2 Act of Parliament, it was proposed that the railway line into and out of Birmingham as it enters Water Orton to be overground partly by way of a viaduct and entering a tunnel at Castle Vale, but after the hs2 Act became law, HS2 changed their mind and proposed a significantly longer tunnel, increasing its length from 2.9km to 5.8km with a portal or 'mouth' at Water Orton. This change was significant both because of the enormity of the structure, and because our communities representations to the HS2 Select Committee before the Act to build the railway was made law, were based on the understanding that there would be a viaduct and not a tunnel mouth, which was something we would most certainly have objected to on amenity grounds and the sheer unacceptability of such a major construction project being undertaken in a residential community because of all the reasons and problems we are now experiencing.

Because This was a different proposal from the development authorised by the HS2 Act and the local Planning Authority North Warwickshire Borough Council, said it needed planning permission and that it was not appropriate for HS2 to use the shorter self-determining consent that HS2 have the legal power to grant consent to themselves for 'minor' alterations under the powers of the HS2 Act. As a council We also said the decision to build the tunnel needed to be informed by the completion of an Environmental Impact Statement. A full review of all the impacts the tunnel would have on local communities, landscape and ecology. Our NWBC position was fortified that the alterations were at the time in the Green Belt, which at the time was then a vitally important strategic land – use planning policy designed to prevent urban sprawl by keeping land between urban areas permanently open or undeveloped so as to prevent towns and communities merging. Unfortunately, the current government has reformed the Greenbelt policy nationally, to release land for 1.5million new homes to be built.

HS2 originally agreed with our NWBC position, even to the extent of submitting an initial scoping document for the Environmental Impact Statement. The Government also at this time accepted that an Environmental Statement was needed.

However, HS2 then changed their minds, instead saying the changes were 'ancillary' to the main development of the HS2 line and could be authorised by the HS2 Act process and submitted a Planning application. The Council rightly refused to determine the application and so HS2 appealed against the council's position and consequently a government Inspector was appointed to review the situation and agreed with NWBC on the main point that a separate, more detailed application setting out and mitigating the significant impacts was needed. However, the Secretary of State (for Communities and Transport) directed that they the Secretary of State, make the final decision. They overruled the Planning Inspector and granted permission to HS2, who consequently started construction work.

Several of the elements of this case are of national importance and are deeply concerning; the Government should not be able to make significant changes to major projects that have significant impacts on communities that have not been properly assessed or about which local community had no chance to comment on. In addition, by directing they make the final decision the Government removed all independence in the process and in effect granted permission for their own project. This could have far reaching consequences for future infrastructure projects here in North Warwickshire and Nationally, especially because HS2 has such a significant impact on numerous North Warwickshire communities.

The Council therefore judicially reviewed the decision and, the High Court upheld the decision. The Court of Appeal acknowledged that there are important elements to this case and have given us NWBC permission to appeal. The Court of Appeal will therefore heard the case on the 6th and 7th May. But unfortunately, the Court of Appeal 'reserved' their judgment and at the time of writing this article we do not know what they determined. I will update you once we know.

One thing we do know is that a Transport and Works Act Order application is also required to legalise the tunnel building but decisions on launching the process to enact this order have been suspended by the Department of Transport until this High Court litigation has been resolved. You may recall that I previously urged residents to petition the Dept of Transport to demand that a Transport and Works Act Order be made By the Sec of state for Transport and I know several residents did. This was important as if the order is to be legally issued we will have a public right to make representations directly to the Secretary of State to inform their decision making about the protect representations which will I expect will be to demand further mitigations for impacts on residents such as vibration; noise flooding; dust ;and traffic disruption. While there is no possibility that the construction works will be halted or that the locality be restored to its state before construction started. At least we can ensure the remaining construction works up until 2039 when the line is now expected to open, are completed properly, to the least local impact. it is daunting taking on the government and a national infrastructure project. But we must continue to fight to get the best mitigation locally and prevent the same happening elsewhere in our communities or across North Warwickshire. Considering the recent Government announcements that the cost of HS2 has risen to £.102.7bn there is no realistic [prospect of a new compensation scheme being created to compensate property owners who have already suffered negative impacts Which are likely to happen again in future as we know the Government has already announced its intention to build a new north south railway line. Hopefully if the new north south railway line goes ahead, it will steer well clear of north Warwickshire! But if it doesn't, we'll be ready and experienced for a fight! Our readiness will be as a local borough council, local communities and as an excellent partnership between Coleshill; Water Orton; Curdworth; Lea Marston; Middleton; and Kingsbury parish councils called the Special Management Zone (SMZ). Who have and continue to extremely effectively represent local community interests both locally for each village and on cross cutting problems that impact on all Parishes such as traffic.

Odour and air Pollution.

Residents in Water Orton, Coleshill and Curdworth have all noticed and objected to the unpleasant odour being generated by the HS2 earthworks. the odour is caused by the use of Lime in the construction process. The lime is commonly used in UK earthworks and ground engineering primarily for soil stabilisation and modification. It dries out wet, cohesive (clay-heavy) soils, improves workability, and alters the soil chemistry to prevent shrinking and swelling. This transforms "unsuitable" site-won earth into a stable, strong foundation for roads, railways, and building. Locally hs2 are re-using the soil extracted from the tunnel boring process to build embankments for the elevated sections of the line in Coleshill. Importantly there are no health risks to residents from the use of the lime locally and following complaints HS2 contractors continue to work closely with the Environment Agency and NWBC Planning and Environmental Health teams about this matter. The specifics around HS2's contractor's approach to these coming earthworks, and the package of intended mitigations, are still in the finalisation stage. More will be communicated in due course. The issue of dust, following a request from residents and the SMZ, HS2 CEO Mark Wild has commissioned an independent Air Quality Assessment report for the Water Orton area via Imperial College London. The findings of this report will be shared once this has been undertaken. This is in addition to the air quality monitoring already undertaken by the Director for Public Health in Warwickshire and Environmental Health team at NWBC. which did not find any harmful impacts from HS2 but did register the usual high levels of nitrogen oxides and carbon monoxide which are attributable to motorway and road traffic.

So, importantly while there is certainly a high level of dust created by hs2 earthworks, it is not harming anyone's health and HS2 are taking local complaints seriously, and will seek to reduce and prevent it as work progresses to completion of the construction of the railway

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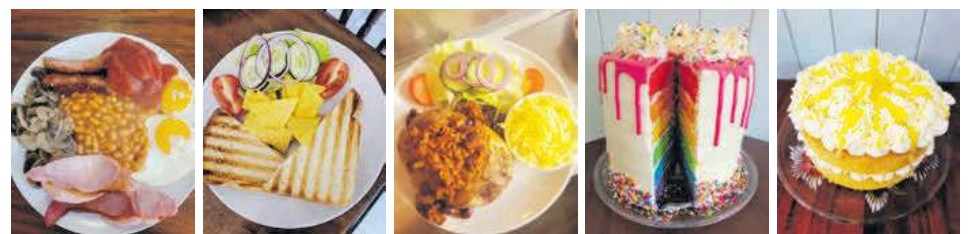
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Firms warn of rising costs and disruption from Iran crisis – Chambers



Three-quarters of West Midlands businesses report an existing or expected impact from the Iran conflict, according to new research from the region's three Chambers of Commerce.

Increased fuel prices and shipping costs, rising prices from suppliers and customer delivery delays were most frequently cited in the data gathered by the Greater Birmingham, Black Country and Coventry & Warwickshire Chambers of Commerce.

More than 120 businesses from the West Midlands Combined Authority area took part in the online research, which was part of a national British Chambers of Commerce survey.

Of the West Midlands firms surveyed, 49 per cent said they are already impacted by the unrest in the Middle East, while 26 per cent expect to be in the future.

The most impacted sectors were manufacturing and production (23 per cent); hospitality, catering and tourism (11 per cent); admin, support and consulting (11 per

cent); and retail and wholesale (7 per cent).

The majority of organisations expect their energy bills to increase in the next year - with 43 per cent anticipating rises of more than 20 per cent.

Thirty per cent expect it to be "fairly difficult" to pay their bills.

One SME wholesale business said: "We are experiencing fuel surcharges on seas freight containers and UK haulage [and] material cost increases in the Far East and India."

A micro hospitality firm said: "We work with long haul flights and holidays. The war has left clients in an unsure situation, where they do not want to travel because of uncertainty.

"Repatriation admin costs are borne by the company, refunds are processed, so there is a loss of profits."

Meanwhile, consulting firms and other service-based organisations described cancelling or postponing overseas training courses, interruptions to ongoing projects, and increasing difficulty completing business transactions.

Henrietta Brealey (pictured), chief executive of Greater Birmingham Chambers of Commerce, said: "The results of this survey demonstrate how quickly global events can create challenges for businesses closer to home.

"Firms across Greater Birmingham and the wider West Midlands are telling us that rising fuel costs, supply chain disruption and ongoing uncertainty are already having a tangible impact on their operations.

"While businesses are resilient, many are facing difficult decisions as costs continue to increase.

"These findings reinforce the need for policymakers to recognise the pressures firms are under and provide the stability and support needed to sustain growth and

investment across our region."

Sarah Moorhouse, chief executive of Black Country Chamber of Commerce, said businesses across Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall, were being hit from every direction.

"We have members forecasting energy bill increases of 77 per cent this year, others facing half a million pounds in additional costs on top of escalating logistics charges" she said.

"The conflict is piling pressure on businesses that were already struggling. The findings reflect the reality facing businesses across the region where Black Country manufacturers, retailers and service firms alike are reporting rising costs, supply chain disruption and growing uncertainty.

"Our members are asking for help with fuel and energy costs and to be kept informed - that is not a lot to ask when you are fighting to keep your doors open."

Corin Crane, group chief executive, Coventry & Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce, said: "This survey shows that businesses across Coventry, Warwickshire and the wider West Midlands, are already feeling the effects of the conflict in Iran, with rising fuel, energy and transport costs placing additional pressure on firms that are already operating in a challenging economic environment.

"Nearly half of businesses told us they have been directly impacted, while many more expect disruption in the months ahead.

"The findings underline the need for government to provide practical support on energy and operating costs, while ensuring businesses receive clear and timely information to help them plan with confidence during a period of continued uncertainty."

The charity offers practical, emotional and financial assistance during challenging times, raises awareness of childhood cancer, and helps to build a strong support network within the community.

Funding Agreed from North Warwickshire Borough Council's Safer Communities Sub-Committee to Help Prevent Crime and Support Local Policing

North Warwickshire Borough Council has shown its continued commitment to keeping communities safe and connected, following a recent funding allocation from the Safer Communities Sub-Committee.

At its meeting on 24th March 2026, the Sub-Committee agreed funding to support the Warwickshire Safer Neighbourhood Team, helping improve both their day-to-day work and how they engage with local residents.

To help prevent crime, the Sub-Committee has agreed to fund £2,000 to buy at least 1,000 Faraday pouches. These small security items help protect keyless cars from theft by blocking electronic signals. They will be given to residents for free across North Warwickshire to help keep their vehicles safe.

A total of £500 will be used to buy televisions, stands and cables. These will be placed at the Safer Neighbourhood Team offices in Coleshill and Atherstone, giving officers better facilities for briefings, online meetings and community updates

on social media. This will help Police with communications at community meetings.

A further £240 has been set aside for a portable speaker and microphone. This will help officers speak clearly at local events and meetings, making it easier to connect with residents and share important information.

This funding shows the Council's practical approach to community safety, focusing on simple improvements that make a real difference. By working closely with the Safer Neighbourhood Team, the Council continues to support safer, stronger communities across North Warwickshire. Councillors have welcomed the funding, highlighting the importance of working together with local police to support and protect residents.

Becky Wrighting, T/Inspector of SNT North Warwickshire, said:

"This funding is a very welcome investment and reflects the strong partnership we have with North Warwickshire Borough Council to keep our communities safe. The improvements will directly support our officers in coordinating their daily

Through experimentation, I began to appreciate its qualities and learned how materials interact across techniques. I am inspired to transform garments and share these techniques with others, encouraging people to value discarded items rather than letting them end up in landfill."

Ed Blackwell, Store Manager at Reloved Brum said: "We are thrilled to be involved in this exciting project. It's clear to see Birmingham has some incredibly talented fashion creators. Seeing donated garments transformed into completely unique pieces has been inspiring for both our team and customers. Projects like this show how charity retail can support sustainability, creativity and the local community all at the same time."

Zoe Hillyard, Senior Lecturer in Textile Design at BCU said: "It has been so enjoyable seeing how customisation and repair skills have built a strong bond between each textile design student and their salvaged garment. Being introduced to heritage hand-stitching skills like gold work, sachiko and needle weaving, the project explored what can happen when you work directly on one garment for a

month. The outcomes are joyful and unique celebrations of technical and creative experimentation!"



The collaboration is a great example of the community working together and underpins the importance of charity shops on our high streets and the positive environmental impact they make. This year alone Birmingham Hospice shops have either sold or recycled 581 tonnes of textiles, saving 7.8m tonnes of CO2 emissions.

Walsh Podiatry is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year. A quarter of a century since the doors first opened at 329 Chester Road in 2001, and the clinic is still right here in Castle Bromwich, busier than it's ever been.

The idea at the start was straightforward. Somewhere local people could come for any foot or lower limb problem and actually get it sorted. A centre of excellence in the heart of the country, as I used to put it back then. Twenty-five years on, that's still exactly what we're trying to be.

The clinic has always been family-run. My wife Jenny has been alongside it from day one as practice manager, and the founding aim has held all the way through: a practice patients enjoy coming to and staff enjoy working at.

What's grown around that is the team. Today we have five podiatrists on the rota, and they're a genuinely strong line-up. Sam Holloway is our clinical lead, with Alex Downton, Lauren Nicholls and Alesia King alongside her. All four are excellent clinicians, each with their own strengths across routine podiatry, nail surgery, MSK, orthotics and rehab. Between them they look after thousands of patients a year, supported by a reception and clinical-assistant team who keep the whole place running smoothly.

My own role has shifted. These days I'm overseeing the practice itself, the team, the systems and the direction we're heading in, and treating MSK patients alongside that. The clinic standing on its own feet, with such capable clinicians delivering the day-to-day care, is one of

the things I'm most proud of after twenty-five years.

The work has come a long way too. When we started, private podiatry was mostly nail care, corns and callus, and some basic biomechanics. We now offer shockwave therapy, MLS laser, SWIFT for verrucas, 3D foot scanning, gait analysis, custom orthotics, and most recently 3D-printed orthotics produced in-house. The tagline we've used for years is "Keeping you Moving and keeping you Comfortable", and that's still the job. The team is bigger, the tools are better, the principle is the same.

None of this would mean anything without the patients. Some of you have been coming to us for the full twenty-five years. We've treated three generations of the same household. People still walk in and tell us they were recommended by a neighbour who first came in 2004. That kind of loyalty doesn't happen by accident, and we don't take a moment of it for granted.

We're not slowing down. New treatments are on the way, the gait lab is developing, MSK capacity is growing, and we'll keep investing in the people, the technology, and the practice itself so we can carry on serving the local community as well as we possibly can.

So on behalf of the whole team, thank you. Thank you to every patient who's trusted us with their feet over the past twenty-five years. Here's to the next chapter.

Record numbers of rural residents and businesses supported with crime prevention across rural South Warwickshire



Record numbers of rural residents and businesses have been supported with crime prevention advice and equipment to help improve their security over the past year, through a programme jointly funded by the Police and Crime Commissioner for Warwickshire and Stratford-on-Avon District Council.

The Rural Crime Advisor service supported 780 people across South Warwickshire during 2025/26, as more residents, landowners and businesses were helped with practical advice and support to protect their homes, property and livelihoods.

The service focuses on prevention, practical advice and reassurance, helping people take proportionate steps to reduce risk and feel more confident in their communities.

Over the past year:

- Crime prevention event engagement increased by 73%
- Residential crime prevention referrals rose by more than 350%
- Loans of security equipment increased by 47%

This reflects growing awareness of the service and strong engagement from rural communities, with more people coming forward to seek advice and support before problems arise.

Thanks to additional funding from the Shared Prosperity Fund to increase working hours, the Rural Crime Advisors, Rebecca and Ali have been able to extend their support to the community extensively in the past year.

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Warwickshire said:

“Reaching record numbers of residents and businesses with practical prevention advice is exactly what this programme is designed to do. By working in partnership with

Stratford District Council, we are helping rural communities take straightforward steps to protect themselves and their property.

“Ensuring support is accessible and focused on prevention is a key part of reducing harm and maintaining confidence in local services.”

A key area of growth has been support for residents in their own homes, with more people requesting tailored crime prevention visits following engagement at community events. This reflects increased awareness of the service and a willingness to take proactive steps to improve security.

Councillor Natalie Gist, Portfolio Holder for Law and Governance at Stratford-on-Avon District Council, said:

“The work of the Rural Crime Advisors is very valuable to our rural communities.

The joint approach between Stratford on Avon District Council and the Police and Crime Commissioner is helping us reach more people across our rural communities

with practical advice and support.

“The strong level of engagement shows that residents and businesses value crime prevention and are taking positive steps to protect themselves, supported by a service that is accessible and responsive to local, rural needs across the District.”

The programme also supports wider community safety priorities, including helping residents and businesses protect themselves from vehicle-related crime, raising awareness of livestock worrying, and working with partners on local issues such as environmental crime.

Both organisations will continue to work together to ensure that rural communities have access to effective prevention advice and support tailored to local needs.

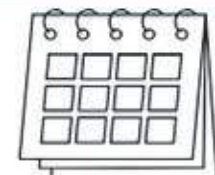

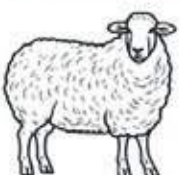

Strong Start to May for Paddy Doyle

Paddy Doyle made a strong start in May, breaking five martial arts records, two strength records and setting one endurance challenge.

The first to fall was:

The most full-contact knee strikes in 1 minute (alternate legs) with 5kg ankle weights on each ankle with Doyle completing 93, beating Asia High Range Book of Records Holder Estarla Mahesh (Taekwondo martial artist) record of 76, set on 12 Feb 2020 in India.

After a short rest, Doyle attempted the most full-contact knee strikes in three 3 minutes (alternate legs with 5kg on each ankle) achieving 245, beating Asia Exclusive World Record Holder Association Athlete Lagishetti Kumar's record of 156 set on 27 Jan 2020, India.

The next of Doyle's challenge attempts was most martial arts full-contact knee strikes (alternate legs 5kg's on each ankle) in 2 minutes, finishing off with a total of 166.

The final strength record was next attempting to surpass the most standing 10kg dumbbell shoulder presses in 1 minute. Digging -deep, Paddy completed 68 dumbbell straight arm shoulder presses, beating Asia Elite World Records Association title holder Suman Singh's record of 54, set on 17th May 2012.



Eight days later Doyle attempted a 13 km cross speed march carrying 35.56lbs backpack over the permanent South Warwickshire hills and footpaths of Yarningale Common, reaching the finish line in 1 hr. 21 min. 41 sec's.



The following week, feeling recovered and eager to go again, the former Para / army reservist and WUMA martial arts Black Belt 4th Dan instructor set his sights on beating more martial arts strength records! Results as follows:

46 full- contact knee strikes in 30 seconds (left leg only 5kg on ankle).



83 strict weightlifting calf raises in 30 seconds holding 30kg dumbbells in each hand, beating Asia Kalam World Record Association title holder IR - Adithyan (Pakistan) record of 78.



Master / Veterans World Record, 915 martial arts shadowing boxing straight arm strikes in 2 minutes (924 punches achieved but 9 punches were discounted) in 2 minutes, beating Asia Kalam World Records Association title holder Pediredla Karaka (India) record of 730.



Doyle said "May has been another tough but positive month for me and the team. The knee strikes were hard as I had to raise the knees to the level of the chest of the appointed support team official. I was very happy increasing my career strength speed stamina challenges and World Records to 1,039. A big thank- you to the support team members who are always there for me."

I applied for my apprenticeship shortly before completing college and successfully progressed through the Royal Air Force selection process, including medical, fitness and aptitude assessments. I then attended a 10-week Basic Training course at RAF Halton, followed by a 15-month Phase 2 training programme to become an Aircraft Avionics Technician. During this time, I completed a range of technical modules covering aerodynamics, aircraft maintenance, electronic and electrical fundamentals, aircraft handling, and safety procedures. Following my training, I was posted to RAF Coningsby, where I undertook a four-month specialist 'Q' course focused on the Typhoon aircraft system, providing the knowledge required to maintain and support the aircraft operationally. Having recently completed my apprenticeship, I am now working as a fully qualified Avionics Technician in the Royal Air Force, serving at the Typhoon Mission Support Centre as an Air Specialist Class 1 Technician.
